What a year the City of Boonville has experienced. There are so many things happening around our City in 2019. The Boonville City Council, Clerk Treasurer, and Mayor have been involved, along with a lot of hard work and planning. We are seeing the success of our labor in the Boonville City Square project.

Burying utilities, pouring new sidewalks, installing decorative lighting, the ability to play music and have security cameras around the Square during future events. Installation of new traffic signal lights in the decorative style the same as the lighting poles. One-way traffic all around the Square for easy traffic flow and diagonal parking which adds 20 plus additional parking slots. Coming later this year we will install two arches across Main and Locust street, they will match all the other style poles and lighting.

Our project is ahead of schedule and under budget. We have accomplished all of this and still maintaining an "A" bond rating with the State of Indiana. We are proud of that and so should you.

The Square Master plan includes many different parties: Warrick Commissioners redoing the Courthouse, Boonville NOW with Johnson Park and Harold Gun Pavilion-we will soon have a completed project and it will be beautiful--all are the result of people working together. People are already starting plans to upgrade their business fronts and talking about new businesses coming to the Square.

Sidewalk projects were completed at **Oakdale** and **Loge** schools this spring. Another new sidewalk project which will connect Northwood Drive to Carlin street, so people will not have to walk in 4th street to get to Loge school. Construction will start before Labor Day.

The **Solar project** at the sewer plant will start August 26 with hooking up the framing and panels. We had such a wet spring and early summer; we couldn't get into the field to install the road. We added storm sewer drainage and raised our entrance to help with flooding. This project will save the sewer plant \$17,000 a month and \$6 million dollars over 30 year in today's dollars.

We have applied for a \$630,000 grant from USDA to add solar panels at our water fields and water plant. This will save \$10,000 worth of electricity per month at those locations. Another win for our customers in the future.

Quail Crossing golf course has been heavily used this year: weddings, parties, receptions and a lot of golf outings as well as individual play-a bargain at \$27 dollars a round. Our **City Pool** had great sponsorship during the season for free pool days and free food for the kids. It shows that Boonville has caring citizens-thank you all for your generosity.

Coming soon will be the **revitalization of 3rd street** from the Square to our northern City boundaries. New curbs, sidewalks and streets. We received a \$4 million-dollar award for this and we will bid it out in January 2022. Exciting times here in Boonville.

An open letter to United Steelworkers Local# 104 members and retirees;

USW Local # 104 would like to invite all of our members and our communities to help us celebrate Labor Day 2019. This national holiday is a celebration of the American labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers.

For many, Labor Day is an end to summer or the start of a political season leading to the next election. It may be a day for one last cookout before the chill of autumn. But for me, it is the one holiday of the year that celebrates all that is good about America. Labor Day is a celebration of the work, the economic achievements and the building and rebuilding of America by American workers. It is a day to celebrate the American worker and all that they have accomplished.

It has been 133 years since the first Labor Day parade in New York City on Sept. 5, 1882 - a Tuesday. The holiday was soon enough moved to Monday, becoming official in 1894. 


