

COMPLETE PROGRAM ANNOUNCED FOR LABOR DAY CELEBRATION

The program for the gigantic Labor Day celebration to be held at Boonville on Sunday and Monday, September 5 and 6, has been announced by the officials.

The annual event is under auspices of the United Mine Workers of America, Sub-District No. 1, of District No. 11 and those affiliated with the A. F. of L.

Following the custom, a sacred service will be held in the Boonville fairgrounds on Sunday afternoon, September 5, beginning at 2:30 o'clock.

An amateur show will be held Sunday night.

The Labor Day celebration proper on Monday, September 6, will begin with the huge parade at 10 a. m. through the principal streets of Boonville and to the fairgrounds, where an all day and evening program will be held.

A new automobile is to be awarded immediately following the free acts Monday night.

Music for the celebration will be provided by the Princeton Oakland City and Boonville high school bands and a Boonville string band.

The entertainment program will include Kay Keiser's Revue, eight free acts.

Blue Grass State Shows will be the principal midway attraction, along with many concessions and other features.

Free admission to the grounds, free parking and plenty of ice water will be available, according to the announcement.
