Notice of Railroad Election.

TO THE VOTERS OF MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP: The qualified voters of Montgomery township are hereby notified that the polls will be opened on Monday, August 20, 1886, at the several voting places in said township to take the votes of the legal voters thereof upon the subject of said township aiding in the construction of the Evansville and Chicago Railroad Company, Incorporated, to the sum of **TWENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS**, by way of an appropriation upon the following conditions:
 1st. Said Evansville and Chicago Railroad Company, Incorporated, shall build, equip and operate a railroad from the town of Evansville, Vanderburgh county, Indiana, through the township of Montgomery, Gibson county, State of Indiana, to a point on the eastern bank of the Wabash river, opposite to near the town of St. Francisville, in the county of Lawrence, State of Illinois.
 2d. Said railroad company shall build its road, and locate and build its depot, within the distance of one mile and a half from the public square in the town of Owensville, township of Montgomery, county of Gibson, State of Indiana, east, west, north or south.
 3d. Said railroad company shall transport and carry wheat and all other grains in bulk, car loads, and watermelons in car loads, from all stations on the line of said road, within said Montgomery township, Vanderburgh county, Indiana, at a rate of freight not exceeding five cents per hundred pounds, and shall transport and carry such freight in car loads, as aforesaid, from all stations in said township of Evansville, Illinois, and to all points beyond Evansville, Indiana, or St. Francisville, Illinois, at a rate not exceeding five cents per hundred pounds over the through rates from Evansville, Indiana, to such points.
 4th. That all freight in car loads carried on said railroad to and from the town of Owensville, in said township, shall be classified according to the Illinois statute on the subject of classification of freight now in force, and all freights in car loads, other than grain and watermelons, shall be carried by said railroad company, at a freight rate which is a reduction according to such classification to the through rates on grain and watermelons above provided to be charged under the conditions of said statute.
 5th. It is the intent of this petition that all those classes of freight which are designated by the Illinois statute above referred to, and which are carried at a lower rate than grain and watermelons, shall also be carried by car loads on this railroad proportionally above or than is allowed herein above for grain and watermelons, and that all those classes of freight which are designated by the Illinois statute above referred to and which are carried at a greater rate than grain and watermelons, shall also be carried by car loads on this railroad at a rate proportionally greater than is allowed herein above for grain and watermelons, and all freight in car loads shall be carried on the line of this road shall be, on equal terms with freight through railroads. The goods herein contained in this petition are to be and remain perpetually in force, no matter in what manner such railroad may fail, or under what name it may be operated.
 No part of the money herein asked to be appropriated shall be paid to such railroad company until the said railroad company shall have satisfied every demand which may be made by the owners, of Gibson county, State of Indiana, pursuant to the statute in force and in conformity with this petition.

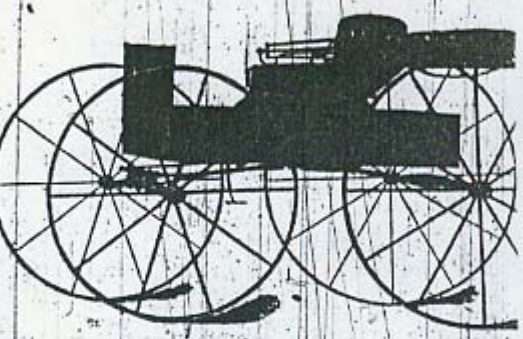
