The old Democratic party., apparently, has practically ceased to exist, and the doctrines of Jefferson, Jackson, Tilden, Bayard, McDonald and Cleveland, have given way to the teachings and leadership of Teller, Towne, Weaver, Allen, Van Vorhis and Pettigrew, none of whom will even consent to wear the name of 'Democraf,' although framing the pollcies and directing the destinies of the present Democratic party. May I not he pardoned, as one who has always been a Demograt of the old, true and stalwart faith, if I decline to follow these now lenders, unknown to Democracy's councils in the past or to Democracy's name in the present, or to give my support to the un-Democratic political heresies which they so openly and unreservedly advocate? So many patriotic Democrats of the old school have of late directly or indirectly affiliated with the Republican party, taking the place of the so-called silver and anti-expansion Republicans, and so many Democrats of the new school have directly or indirectly affiliated with the Populist party, that it would seem that hereafter we are to have the Republican Democratic party (and I might mention in passing that the party of Thomas Jefferson was the Republican-Democratic party) arrayed igainst the Populist-Democratic party, and in such a contingency I do not lesitate to take my place with the
