



DEATH'S HARVEST.

As usual, accidents were the order of the day on the Fourth here and elsewere throughout this great and glorious land of the free and the home of the brave Regardless of the many appeals for a safe and sane celebration of the Fourth, there were those, old as well as young, who know no other way to display their over-abundance of patriotism than by employing methods dangerous to life, limb and property, and as a result the wires are humming with tales of suffering and death, fire loss other property damage and throughout the country, and business is brisk with undertakers, sawbones and insurance adjusters According to the reports fifty-nindeaths occurred on the Fourth and 3,169 were injured in various parts of the country as a result of the celebration of the natal day. Of this number 1,118 were injured by fireworks, 100 by cannon, 200 by firearms, .155 by gunpowder, 64 by tov pistols and 40 by runaways due to fireworks. 
New Building (OLD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.)






