Central Labor Union Wednesday Evening Rousing

New Zeal Injected Into Delegates on a Broader and More Beneficial Basis.

The Central Labor Union held its second bi-monthly meeting in their hall Wednesday evening, and a good sprinkling of delegates were in attendance. A new zeal was injected into the delegates and a firm resolve was made to reorganize the city and reestablish a greater demand for Union label goods.

The auditing committee, who was chosen to investigate the accounts and reports of the Labor Day committee, reported that all matters were correct and that the amount of \$332.47 turned over was correct.

A donation of \$5 was made to the Shirt and Laundry Workers now on strike through the eastern states.

The plan of reorganization was formulated by the chair selecting John Loten, Charles Yochum and J. C. Mayes as committee on organization, and they will proceed at once to start the ball rolling.

The announcement of the purchase of the Labor News was made and further financial assistance was extended to the new proprietors to make the venture a better official organ.

CHURCH CLUBS TO BE ACTIVE IN POLITICS

"Men Above Party" to be Slogan at Evansville, May Wield Much Influence.

Evansville, Ind., Sept. 20. The churches of Evansville will take an active interest in the approaching city campaign. In most of the Protestant churches men's clubs have been organized and several meetings have been held.

The members of these clubs will recognize no party in the election, but say they will vote for the man, their motto being "Men above party." One of fifty members and the president of the organization says the club will be able to control as many as fifty votes in addition to the membership.

The club idea is gaining ground among the churches of the city, and it is predicted it will be a strong factor in the coming election. The church idea originated here in the summer of 1904, the object then being to ask the old parties to nominate their best men for the county offices.

The contest for the Republican nomination for mayor is growing intense each day. The nominating convention will be held on the afternoon of September 27, and the delegates will be selected the night before.
