When other questions are dulled for the time being the question of obnoxious billboards comes bobbing up like a cork from a champagne bottle—all of a sudden.

For instance, the Kansas City Star says: "If, as some mind readers claim, the mysterious processes of telepathy could stamp upon inanimate things the motives and identities of the persons who handle them, more strange tales would be told than have ever been spoken or penned."

The Star insists that it is the right of Kansas City to be beautiful. It calls the attention of the authorities of the city to the evidence of public opinion on the subject furnished by indignant citizens who tore down an offensive billboard "and tumble it down the hill."

Kansas City is not alone in keeping up the sentiment against the nuisance and the evil of the billboard. The commissioners of Cook county have rejected an offer of \$13,500 for billboard privileges on the fence surrounding the site of the old court house now being razed...

Perhaps the action of the commissioners of Cook county is more to be commended than the action of the citizens of Kansas City, who took the law into their own hands—always a bad thing to do—and tumbled the offensive billboards "down the hill."
