City Council Passes **Budget Appropriations** 

The City Council meeting in special session Monday night passed a 1951 budget appropriation of \$79,522.78 to be raised by taxation. The total budget, including items not financed through the tax levy, is \$103.-259.80

This will result in a civil city tax rate of \$1 x6 per \$100, compared with this year's civil city rate of \$1.31.
