Tleman, chief marshal; William Becker, color bearer; David Henderson, Ben Tilcamp, aides; speakers' carriage, Mother Jones, Miners 390, Miners 1452, Miners 1065, Miners 1107, visiting miners, plumbers, horseshoers, blacksmiths and helpers, moulders, stove mounters, barbers, structural iron workers, teamsters.

Second Division

Form on Third-st between Ingle and Division, head resting on Third and Division—Band, Ralph Stevens, marshal; Fred J. Hohenberger, J. Ruff, aides; woman's label league, garment workers, brewery workers, beer bottlers, bar tenders, waiters, coopers, cigar makers' rube band, cigar makers, painters, paper hangers, retail clerks, grocery clerks, meat cutters, stage employes, moving picture operators, stationary engineers and musicians.

Third Division

Form on Division between Second and Third-sts, head resting on Division and Third—Band, August Eltonhead, marshal; George Appel, Thomas Matthews, aides; Allied Printing Trades council, pressmen, typographical, book binders, machinists, Potters 72, Potters 5, sheet metal workers metal polishers, Electrical workers 535, Electrical workers 16, glass bottle blowers, concrete workers, plasterers, hod carriers.
