

# Labor Celebration Plans Completed At Mt. Carmel

The sixteenth annual Southern Indiana Labor Day Association celebration will be held at Mt. Carmel, Ill., for the first time next Monday, September 2nd.

The Southern Indiana Association was founded 16 years ago by a group of laboring men for the purpose of establishing lasting friendship, cooperation and good will among the ranks of organized labor, their employers and the general public.

Each year in the past the celebration has been held in a southern Indiana city, but this year the celebration has been awarded to Mt. Carmel, which has recently become a member of the association. Other cities which have been hosts for the celebration include: Princeton, Boonville, Vincennes, and Washington.

Louis Austin, vice-president of District 11, United Mine Workers of America, with headquarters in Terre Haute, will be master of ceremonies for the third consecutive year.

Gerald W. Landis, congressman from the seventh congressional district, will be one of the featured speakers, along with Sherman Minton, United State Senator from Indiana and Oscar D. Brissenden, an Illinois farm leader.

Mayor Charles A. Martin of Mt. Carmel will give the address of welcome, following the usual mammoth street parade at 10 a. m. Mr. Brissenden will speak at 11:15. The afternoon session will open with a band concert at 1 o'clock, followed by the addresses by Landis and Minton. Entertainment features will include a balloon ascension and parachute jump by Ray Porter, famed daredevil, the Great Courtney, comedy juggling star, the Riehl Duo, gymnasts, the Beverly Sisters, dancers, Bud Yoder and his Ozark Mountaineers, the Flying Sullivans and Jack Savant, musical star formerly with one of the Major Bowes units.

The Sunday afternoon sacred service will be held September 1st, with the sermon by the Rev. H. M. McDonough of Mt. Carmel. Music will be supplied by the Calvary Jubilee Singers, the Todrank quartet, and a colored quartet.

Sunday evening an amateur variety program will be held. Among those scheduled to appear on this program are Glenn and Rex, a cowboy duet from Lynnville, a mandolin and guitar duet by Martha Jane Miller of Evansville, and Helen Lorain Lenn of Boonville, and the Prairie Maids, Emma Lou and Betty, also from Boonville.

A prize of fifty dollars will be awarded to the business firm having the best float and a seventy-five

dollar prize will be given to the firm having the best entry. Various other awards will also be made.
