

# 50,000 View UMW Labor Day Parade

Estimated 30,000 Pack Fair-  
grounds at Princeton  
for Annual Event

PRINCETON, Sept. 5.—(Special)  
—A record crowd turned out today  
for the annual Labor day parade  
and program which was generally  
conceded to be the finest ever pre-  
sented in Princeton.

An estimated 50,000 persons wit-  
nessed the mammoth parade this  
morning and more than 30,000  
jammed the Gibson county fair-  
grounds for the program which  
followed.

The event was sponsored by the  
Labor Day association of sub-dis-  
trict 1, District 11, UMWA, with  
other AFL affiliates participating.

## International Official Speaks

Principal speaker of the day was  
Thomas Raney, international board  
member of district 20, UMWA. John  
Sherman Cooper, former Kentucky  
senator, and George Harvey, of the  
Farm Bureau Co-operative associa-  
tion, also spoke.

Robert Tuley, of Boonville, was  
master of ceremonies for today's  
program. A heavy rain around  
noon, which lasted for an hour,  
had no effect on the crowd. City  
streets were lined with cars and  
all available parking space in and  
near the fairgrounds was packed  
with vehicles.

Delivering a strong attack on  
communism, Mr. Raney declared  
this nation wants no part of com-  
munism.

He reminded his listeners that  
the highest wages in the world  
are paid in the United States.
