

# For Labor Day Announced

Final plans including assignment of parade positions for Labor Day celebration were completed at the last meeting of delegates of the U.M.W. of A. and those affiliated with the U.M.W. of A., A.F. of L. and C.I.O. Labor Day association meeting Sunday, Aug. 24, in Hornaday Park in Petersburg.

The celebration will be held on Sunday, Aug. 31, and Monday, Sept. 1, at Hornaday Park in Petersburg.

The Sunday program, which begins at 2:30 p.m., with Milton Board of Princeton as master of ceremonies, will include the invocation by Gene Carrol, Petersburg, and speaker, Rev. William Reynolds of Boonville. Music will be furnished by Burlin quartet of Winslow, Norlog quartet of Lynnville and the Freedom quartet of Boonville.

The Sunday evening program beginning at 8 p.m. will be a 12-act amateur show.

Highlight of Monday's program will be the big parade, which will begin at 10 a.m. The Boonville Veterans of Foreign Wars post will lead the parade with Local 8188 of Boonville as the first organization in the parade followed by Arthur Local 1396, Wasson Local 8542, Enos Local 5179, Sunlight Local 3437, Tecumseh Local 7661, King Station Local 5584. Lynnville Local 9926 is tenth in line; Ditney Hill Local 7693 in position twelve and Boonville Local 6873, thirteenth.

The remainder of the morning program with Robert S. Tuley of Boonville as master of ceremonies, will include the national anthem followed by an address by Ray Greene, mayor of Petersburg, at 10:45, followed by music by the Hillsiders.

The afternoon program will feature an address by John Watkins, Lieut. Governor of Indiana, and Louis Austin, International Board member, District 11, U.M.W. of A., Terre Haute. Remainder of the afternoon program will include acts by Barnes-Carruthers circus; music by the Hillsiders and a 7-class horse show beginning at 4 p.m.

Float judges will be Harry Simons of Princeton, Hubert Esmeier of Winslow, Walter Rausch of Petersburg, Keller Thompson of Winslow and Herschel Toller of Winslow.
