

# Lynnville Coal Wins First Place In Parade

Warrick county U. M. W. locals walked off with several of the prizes offered during the annual Labor Day parade which climaxed the 3-day event at Petersburg.

Winning prizes in Monday's parade were:

Lynnville Local 9926, \$100 first prize for the unit having the best display of dress uniforms. Second and third prizes went to Enos Mine Local 5179 and Boonville Local 7661.

Blackfoot Local 352, \$50, Local with best percentage of attendance over 100.

Saxton Local 8938 and Squaw Creek Local 1189 split prize money with 100 percent attendance each, in the category offering \$50 to the Local having the best attendance under 100.

Enos Local 5179, loving cup; miners Local with best attendance percentage and best parade appearance.

Enos won a \$100 first prize, Lynnville won a \$50 second and Potter-Brumfield Local 1459 won a \$25 third for best union floats.

The Business Men's Association of Spurgeon and the Petersburg Chamber of Commerce were first and second in the business men's floats division. The Evansville Old Time Auto club was represented in the Petersburg display with 18 vintage autos.

Members of 17 union locals in Southern Indiana participated in the annual event. Observers stated that this year's crowd beat all since the observance started in 1921. Attendance was estimated at 15,000.

Speakers at the event at Hornaday Park were Winfield K. Denton, who represents the 8th district in Congress, and Michael Widman of Washington, international representative for U. M. W.

Robert Tuley of Boonville was master of ceremonies during the event. Henry Mason, Spurgeon, is president of the Labor Day Association.
