10,000 PERSONS VIEW PARADE

What is believed to be a record crowd attended the big Labor Day celebration in Boonville, Monday, Sept. 8, when over 10,000 people witnessed an elaborate parade and many activities. Sacred services highlighted the Sunday program and an amateur show was featured that night. Sunlight Local, U. M. W. No. 3437, of Boonville, was awarded first prize for the best decorated float in the parade Monday morning. Second prize for floats went to Kings Mine Local of Princeton and third prize to Winslow Local. Boonville Disabled American Veterans won first prize for commercial and organization floats and The Model department store of Boonville, second. Attendance prizes for locals over

100 members went to Sunlight local for those under 100 in Cedar Valley local of Mackey. A loving cup awarded on the basis of attendance and display went to Cedar Valley local. Wason local of Big Creek took first honors in the display of dress uniforms. Blackfoot local of Arthur was second and Sunlight local placed third.
