More scrubbers planned for Gibson Station

ELKHART — Clowry Corp. said Thursday it plans to spend \$1.2 billion through 2008 to cut energy-intensive pollution from its coal-fired power plants.

The Cincinnati-based utility parent company of Public Service Indiana, plans to install scrubbers to reduce sulfur dioxide pollution from several large coal-fired operations, while installing several existing scrubbers at plants to improve their ability to reduce emissions.

The company also plans to install a selective catalytic reduction unit at its Cayuga plant to reduce nitrogen oxide emissions.

Clowry also plans to build and test a combination of advanced carbon injection with lightweight technology as one of its smaller power

plants. The combined fuel sulfur could produce less mercury and particulate from reduced gases, according to a company news release.

The company will finish a second phase of its pilot when more information known about the CO₂ capture requirements, design and performance of various removal technologies.

Depending on various market rates, the price could be a \$1.2 billion investment in the first phase without reduction less a more than \$2 billion for its plants.

Earlier this spring, P began construction of a scrubber at Gibson County's Princeton Unit 4. It's called a scrubber on Unit 4 as well.
