The evacuated area was ghost town. Milk bottles had been left on back porches. Clothes lines in the backyard. The area was almost bare of life. Weary firemen worked to prevent the flames from spreading beyond the tank farm. The fire jumped across Inpolis Boulevard into a tank known as the "Indiana Field" of the 20 or 30 tanks of eru in the field ignited, but quickly doused it and pushed flames back across the highway. The initial blast, which occurred about 6:15 a. m. CDT, caused the heaviest damage. The hydroformer unit, large of its kind in the world, was broken into an unrecognizable mass of metal. Where it stood nearly 100 feet high, the major portion was left in a pile about 20 feet high. The explosion knocked people from their beds within an area of at least five blocks. Windows were shattered for miles around and the tremor itself was felt in Ottawa Beach, Mich., nearly 100 miles away. Hunks of four-inch carbon steel shaft went through some of them 100 feet long, and fell into nearby homes. One steel shaft went through wall of the home of Frank niaw, injuring him and his killing their son, Richard, 3, tearing the leg from Ronnie. The other fatality was a company employe who died of a attack brought on by exertion fighting the fire. A company spokesman reported that three men from the crew of 17 to 20 working at plant at the time of the blast missing. Later, however, a spokesman said so far as was learned all of the men had accounted for.
