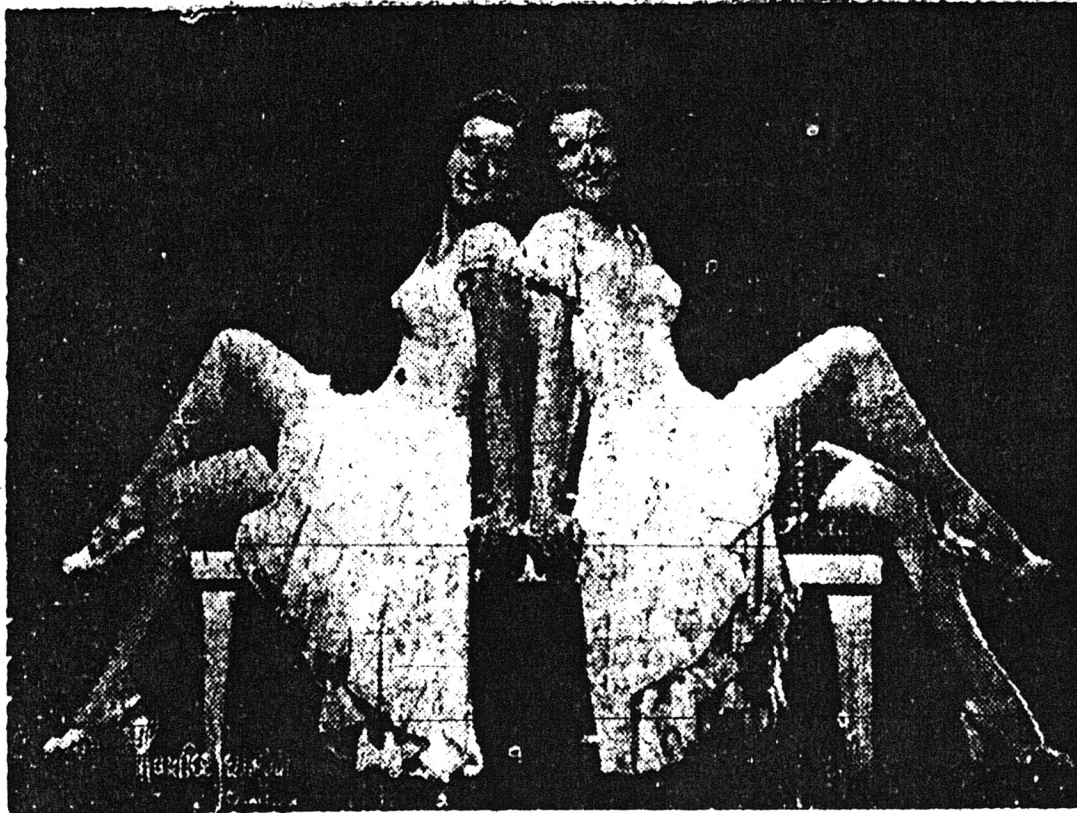

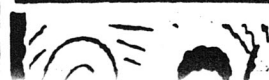
### WICHITA, KAN., GROWS OUT OF ITS COUNTY
