The industrial magnate thus joins his business associate, chairman John J. Raskob of the Democratic national committee, in the campaign for the New York governor.

"I believe that we have in Governor Smith a man who the strength of character to correct the evils of enforcement, to lay all the facts before the people to guide their determination, and to make the recommendations necessary for the solution of the liquor problem," Du Pont said.

Du Pont explained that he has voted Republican with the exception of casting his ballot for Woodrow Wilson, which is the history likewise of Raskob's politics.

## LABOR DAY-SEPT. 3 DESIGNATED BY GOV. JACKSON, HOLIDAY

INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 10 — (UP) —Governor Ed Jackson today issued his annual labor day proclamation, designating September 3 as a legal holiday.

"Each year of the history of our county has been marked a material advancement in physical and spiritual growth," said the proclamation. "Labor has been the fundamental element in this development and in recognition of this a wholesome custom has been established to set apart one day each year to pay respect and tribute to those who labor."

The governor suggested "that as far as possible the people desist from their usual vocations and by suitable exercises pay respect to the laboring men and women of the United States."

The captain at first sustained painful injuries to his back, but no bones were broken and he is able to visit our quarters daily, give instructions, witness the various maneuvers of the battery, etc.
