PRINCETON, Ill., Aug. 23 —(UP)—Seven men, all laborers enroute to a work camp, were killed and three more were injured when the freight train on which they were riding jumped the track at Wyanett, near here, late yesterday. All had been members of an extra gang working near Galeburg and were riding on top of an oil tank car when a brake rod broke and ten cars toppled over an embankment.
