**PLEAD NOT GUILTY
TO CHARGES AS
RESULT OF RAID**

Bill Judkins and Charles Miller, both of Elberfeld, arrested Saturday morning when Sheriff Summers and Deputy Earl Hollen made a raid on a house about 11 miles east of Haubstadt, pleaded not guilty to charges of possession of a still and manufacturing intoxicating liquor, when arraigned in circuit court before Judge Claude A. **CHICAGO WHEAT
DROPS TO LOWEST
PRICE IN A YEAR**

CHICAGO, Ill., July 23.—(U-P)—Wheat dropped to the lowest levels of the season on the Chicago Board of Trade today, forced down by a deluge of bearish influences.

The grain closed 4 3/4 to 5 1/4 cents lower. Other grains followed.

Wheat was 50 cents below the season's high and from 17 to 24 cents below the price of a year ago.
