LABOR DAY CELEBRATION

Labor, as represented in Gibson and the surrounding counties in this section of Indiana, is celebrating Labor Day today at the Gibson County Fair Grounds where, following the arrival of a large parade of workers, many of them who are anxious to work but are probably not employed at the present, there is entertainment to suit the desire of all.

Music from several bands, speeches for those who care to hear arguments and oratory and then vaudeville acts on the platform, which will conclude an eventful day.

Most of the concessions at the fairgrounds during the past week remained over for this day, when admission to the grounds will be free, and there will be plenty doing from early morning until late at night when the workers, who come for a day of rest and pleasure, will wend their way home and probably feel the strain of day greater than had they followed their usual avocation.

Princeton and Gibson county extends a welcome to their visiting neighbors today. They have been here before on similar occasions and will doubtless come again. If the day is not a success it will not be the fault of those who have been working long and zealously to make it so.

Labor Day celebrations have been compelled to go to the small cities for recognition. In the larger cities the great majority of laborers take advantage of this day to take long automobile trips, give their family a deserved vacation and indulge in other forms of amusement which does not necessitate a long march on paved streets in a hot sun. Coming on Monday it gives the city worker an opportunity to visit the country.

In years past Labor Day in Princeton has been an outstanding entertainment for those who attended and it is hoped that this day will meet expectations.
