# RE-ELECTION, SAYS

MARION, Ill., Aug. 9.—(UP)—Decision of Harry L. Fishwick, president of the Illinois district of the United Mine Workers not to run for re-election "will help materially" to iron out differences between factions of the United Mine Workers, Adolph Germer, vice president of the "reorganized" union, told the United Press.

Germer said that sentiment against the present state district organization "was due largely to animosity against Fishwick and now Fishwick has removed himself."

"Because of the opposition and pressure which the John L. Lewis forces had aroused against Fishwick, which was simply Lewis propaganda, Fishwick's decision will go a long way to mollify the general situation," according to Germer.

Sentiment in this coal mining section, among members of the "reorganized" union, which Alex Howat heads, was said to be for John H. Walker, secretary of the union, as successor to Fishwick.
