## Three Planes In Air On Trans-Ocean Trips

ANXIETY BEING FELT, HOWEVER, FOR ST. RAPHAEL, WITH TWO MEN AND PRINCESS WINDSOR AND LONDON FLIGHTS UNDER WAY.

(BULLETIN)

OTTAWA, Ontario, Canada, Sept. 1.—(U.P.)—Anxiety of the safety of the London to Ottawa airplane, St. Raphael, carrying two aviators and a princess, grew steadily in Ottawa this afternoon.

Many waiting for a chance to greet the first woman to cross the Atlantic by air were beginning to view the absence of reports of the plane as an indication that the plane had met with mishap.

ST. JOHNS, Newfoundland, Sept. 1.—(U.P.)—The Fokker monoplane, St. Raphael, carrying a 63-year-old princess and two British aviators, on an attempted non-stop flight from Upson, England, to Ottawa, Canada, was due to pass over or near here this morning.

Twenty-three hours had passed at 7:10 a. m. today, Newfoundland summer time (5:10 a. m. eastern standard time) since the St. Raphael was reported to have passed out to sea at Galway Bay, Ireland. A total of 1,900 miles of open water to the coast of Newfoundland was then ahead.

The plane, during its flight across Ireland, averaged 75 miles an hour. Maintaining that speed, St. Raphael should reach the coast of Newfoundland between 9 and 10 a. m. (6 and 7 a. m. central standard time). Hundreds of people watched thru the night at St. Johns and Harbor Grace, confident that the Princess Anne of Lowenstein-Wertheim and the two aviators, Capt. Leslie Hamilton and Col. F. F. Minchin, would arrive safely.

The weather was ideal all night, but at 7:30 a. m. the sky suddenly became overcast, a fog began closing in, making visibility bad.

### CARLING PLANE TAKES OFF ON ENGLISH HOP

LONDON, England, Sept. 1.—(By U.P.)—The London, Ontario, to London, England, monoplane, "Sir John Carling," hopped off from the Carling Airline here at 5:33 a. m. today for Harbor Grace, Newfoundland.

At the controls were Capt. Terrence Tully and Lieut. James Medcalf, who planned to make a stop at Harbor Grace for fuel before starting on their trans-Atlantic flight. Nearly 3,000 spectators were at the Airline at dawn to witness the start of the \$35,000 prize flight and saw a perfect take-off as Tully and Medcalf nosed their craft into an slight westerly wind.

### PLANS NEARING COMPLETION FOR GREAT LABOR DAY

GIGANTIC PARADE AT 10 A. M. MONDAY STARTS OFF FINE PROGRAM LASTING UNTIL LATE AT NIGHT

All arrangements, with exception of the usual last minute details, are complete for the gigantic Labor Day celebration in Princeton on next Monday, Sept. 5, which will have an all day and evening program more extensive than anything of the sort ever attempted in this entire section.

Princeton will no doubt be the mecca for thousands of visitors, as well as residents of the city, on next Monday and the Gibson county fairgrounds, where the major part of the program will be carried out, is expected to be thronged from early morning until late at night.

Monday's celebration here this year is a joint gathering of union labor south of the B & O and Farm Bureau organizations, in addition to merchants competing in the parade for prizes on best displays, including floats.

The gigantic parade which will form in the south part of the city, will move north in Prince street promptly at 10 a. m. under direction of Parade Marshal H. J. Fritz, of this city, and a corps of assistants. The line will move to Broadway, then west to Hart, north to State, east to Main, north on Main to Spruce and west to the fairgrounds. Entering at the northeast gate, the entire line will parade around the race track, past the amphitheater and judges, who from the free net platform will make their awards of first and second prizes for best parade displays of labor unions, Farm Bureau and merchants, after which the parade will disband.

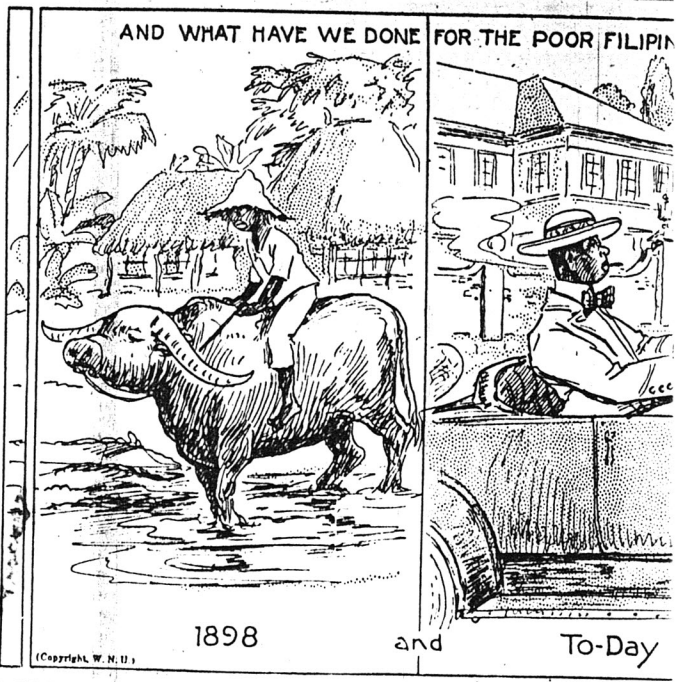
W. H. Settle, president of the Indiana Farm Bureau, will be the farmers speaker of the day and a noted labor speaker is also being provided. Speeches will be given at the fairgrounds both before and after the dinner hour.

The afternoon program at the grounds consists of music by the Petersburg band, which has been hired to play throughout the day and evening, as well as to head the parade, free acts which will be here for the Gibson county fair, horse shoe pitching contest, tug of war, balloon ascension. In the evening, music, a three bout boxing show, battle royal, free acts and a grand display of fireworks, will round out the fine program, which will continue until after 10 o'clock.

The Petersburg band and Patoka Community band have been hired by the labor unions and it is expected a number of other musical organizations will be in the line of march.

All roads lead to Princeton and the Gibson county fairgrounds on Labor Day, next Monday, Sept. 5.
