Leaving the doctor's office she hurried through the Illinois Central subway to take a train and saw the assassin creep up behind Lingle, fire a bullet into his head and flee.

The prosecutor said his investigators would await the witness' recovery from a nervous breakdown before questioning her. He was certain she would be a key witness.
