CONVICTED FOR LABOR DAY

FOR BELL BOY EVANSVILLE'S CELEBRATION TO
OLD MAN BE AT GARVIN PARK.

Twenty Years to Life Imprisonment Will Raney, of This City, One of the
the Penalty—Hotel Guest Was Speakers—McNamara Protest
Murdered in His Room. Parade to Be Given.

NEW YORK, Sept. 1.—The jury in the case of Paul Geidel, 17-year-old bell boy charged with murdering William Jackson, returned a verdict of murder in the second degree today. The punishment is from 20 years to life imprisonment. The jury went out at 3:20 yesterday afternoon.

Jackson was murdered in his room at the hotel where Geidel was employed as bell boy. Geidel at first confessed, then repudiated his confession that he deliberately killed the old man for his money. An effort was made to show the victim had died from heart disease and not directly from the injuries.

Sentence will be imposed on the prisoner next Tuesday. It is not believed he will appeal.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Sept. 1.—Arrangements are now completed for the Labor Day celebration at Garvin's park, Sept. 4, and matter advertising the event is being sent to the surrounding towns. Reduced rates into Evansville have been secured on all railroads, steamboats, and traction lines for the celebration, and it is expected that the city will be crowded with visitors.

One of the entertainments scheduled is a public wedding to take place in the afternoon, at the park. Besides this there will be free vaudeville, equilibristic stunts, acrobatic performances, and grotesque comedy acts to entertain the crowd.

Orators, famous in union circles, will be present and make addresses. Among them are Hon. O. P. Smith of Logansport, Ind., National Organizer of the A. F. of L.; W. D. Van Horn, of Terre Haute, president of District 11, United Mine Workers of America; and William Raney, National Board Member of the United Mine Workers of America.

During the day the Butchers' Union and the Woman's Label League will hold a barbecue and German lunch.

The feature of the celebration will be the "McNamara Protest" parade at 9 o'clock in the morning. By this parade the union men will voice their protest to the McNamara charges and it is the intention to have practically all locals of the city represented in the big body of marchers.
