CLOSED SUNDAY**

Contracts for the Labor Day celebration here September 7, were closed yesterday at a meeting in the C. L. U. hall. Reports of committees were heard and all that remains to be done are a few small details.

The Labor Day association stressed particularly that admission to the grounds, amphitheater, parking spaces and entertainment would be free.

A contract for taking motion pictures of the celebration has been closed, with a company whose name was not made known.
