SOLDIERS MAY NOT VOTE

ABSENT VOTERS WILL NOT HAVE
RIGHT IN MUNICIPAL
ELECTION.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Sept. 3.—
According to the interpretation placed
on the absent voters' law by W. W.
Thompson and W. H. Thompson, mem-
bers of a commission that was appointed
by Governor Goodrich to interpret
ambiguous acts of the 1917 legislature
relating to elections, Indiana soldiers
and other voters absent from the state
on election day next November
will not have the right to vote by

proxy. Some men point out that the absent
voters' law applies only to general,
primary or primary elections, and that
