DEARING UPON... far as it is practicable to enact and apply such laws. It is for exactly this reason that in these columns a national law bearing upon rate regulation has been advocated. Already half the states in the union have laws bearing upon this subject, and there will be more. While these laws are similar in purpose and in many provisions, it is inevitable that they must vary considerably in details, and it is just as inevitable that these differences should be hindrances to business. A reasonable national law would remove the necessity for many of these state provisions, and be infinitely better for all concerned, including the common carriers themselves.

### WORKINGMEN'S SERMON

Rev. Gaiser Preaches Able Sermon to Laborers Sunday.

Rev. J. M. Gaiser, of the Broadway Cumberland Presbyterian church, preached a very able sermon to the workingmen Sunday morning. Rev. Gaiser chose for his text, "The Signs of the Times."

He discussed the relations existing between the employers and the employees. Each has a feeling of antagonism for the other that ought not to exist.

The average employer wants his employees to work long and hard for small wages; the employees want as short hours, light work and high wages as it is possible for them to get. Hence the everlasting warfare between capital and labor.

Rev. Gaiser pointed out the only remedy for the existing evil is the Golden Rule. He cited as an example "Golden Rule" Jones, of Toledo, whose every dealing with his employees is on the basis of the Golden Rule. He also commended strongly the cooperative plan of employers' dealing with employees, or the diversion of profits with the laborers who caused the profits to be made.
