A BIG DELEGATION

BIG SUNDAY CROWD

IN LABOR DAY PARADES IN NEW YORK AND CHICAGO.

FROM PRINCETON ATTENDS VINCENNES CELEBRATION

THREE THOUSAND PEOPLE AT FAIR GROUNDS SUNDAY.

Chicago has, Biggest Demonstration in the Country—Wage Workers "Fourth of July."

More Than 300 Tickets Sold for Morning Train and More go on Noon Train.

The Big Exhibition is on in Full Blast—Excellent Prospects for Good Weather.

NEW YORK, Sept. 4.—Today is wage workers' Fourth of July and throughout the United States labor organizations are celebrating. Tens of thousands of laboring men marched here and at Chicago, where the biggest celebration in the country was held.

Princeton sent a fine delegation to Vincennes to attend the Labor Day celebration there today.

The morning train carried over 300 Princetonians, while many more went to the Old Post town this afternoon.

The Princeton delegation formed at the city building and the following organizations participated in the parade to the E. & T. H. station: President, Vanstone, of the Central Labor Union; Princeton band Plasterers, I. B. P. H. No. 208; Federation, Painters, and Carpenters. There were more than 200 in line.

Vincennes had prepared a great program for the day and no doubt all the visitors will greatly enjoy the occasion. Next year Princeton will celebrate Labor Day.
