as a result of the collision last year

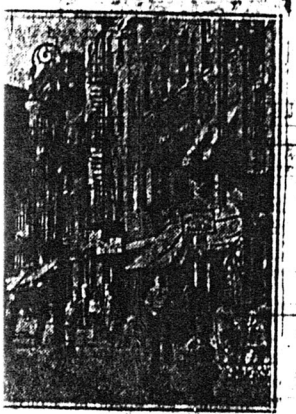
