Dishes must be thoroughly washed.
 This department advises sterilizing
 the dishes after washing by dipping
 in boiling water.

Ice cream spoons and dishes should
 be thoroughly washed and sterilized.

Lemonade shall be prepared from
 lemons, sugar and water. Harmless
 coloring may be used if declared by
 labeling.

Orangeade shall be prepared from
 oranges, sugar and water. Harmless
 coloring may be used if declared by
 labeling.

The use of any sweetening other
 than sugar is prohibited by law in this
 state.

Imitation or artificial beverages
 prepared from powders may be sold
 if labeled imitation or artificial or
 sold under a distinct name.

Cider is the pressed juice of the
 apple. It must not be fermented.
 Hard cider contains alcohol, which is
 prohibited. Artificial or imitation
 cider or apple drinks are prohibited
 if they are prepared from vinegar or
 other unwholesome products.

Acid drinks, such as lemonade, must
 not be put into metal containers. The
 acid dissolves metals which render the
 beverage poisonous. Only glass con-
 tainers should be used and those
 must be properly covered as a pro-
 tection against dust and flies.

Distilled water ice only may be used
 in beverages.

Coffee shall be prepared from ground
 coffee and not from cereal or chicory
 compounds.

Any person who empties the uncon-
 sumed contents of a glass back into
 the original supply will be prosecuted.

Milk must be fresh and clean and
 kept in contact with ice until served.

Milk shakes must be made from
 whole milk.

Buttermilk must be wholesome and
 prepared and handled under sanitary
