CHRISTIAN SCIENCE NOTES

"Man" is the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all churches of Christ-Scientist, on Sunday, September 2.

Among the citations which comprise the Lesson-Sermon is the following from the Bible: "Then He called His twelve disciples together, and gave them power and authority over all devils, and to cure diseases. And He sent them to preach the kingdom of God, and to heal the sick. And the apostles, when they were returned, told Him all that they had done. And He took them, and went aside privately into a desert place belonging to the city called Bethsaida" (Luke 9:1, 2, 10).

The Lesson-Sermon also includes the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Jesus beheld in Science the perfect man, who appeared to him where shining mortal man appears to mortals. In this perfect man the Science saw God's own likeness, and this correct view of man healed the sick. Thus Jesus taught that the kingdom of God is in fact universal, and that man is pure and holy" (p. 170).
