GENEVA, Sept. 4 -- (A) The League of Nations council today adopted the report of the commission on reorganization of the council, providing for the creation of three new non-permanent council seats and designating Germany as a permanent seat holder as soon as she is elected to league membership.

Pasage of the commission's report in favor of creating three non-permanent seats along with its recommendation that Germanw alone should be given a permanent chair constituted a victory for France and her ally, Poland but was not obtained without difficulty.
