ASK DONATIONS FOR LABOR MEET

FINE PROGRAM ASSURED WITH
FOUR BANDS AND THREE
ABLE SPEAKERS

The committees in charge of the big Labor day celebration here September 3, announce that solicitation of funds from merchants will begin this week. The Princeton Advertising club has already donated \$300.

Most of the unions have made their donations and a nice fund is on hand.

Many floats have been assured for the parade. There will be a prize for the best commercial float and for the best labor union representation. The miners also will compete for their cup which is given annually to the mine local making the best turnout.

The program at the fairgrounds will include a balloon ascension, free acts and at night a display of fireworks.

There will be at least four bands and the speakers committee gives assurance that there will be three nationally known speakers.
