SHOT TO DEATH

CHICAGO, Sept. 8. — (AP) — Miss Elyn Danielson, 22, operator of a ~~auto parlor~~, was found shot to death last night in the one-room apartment of Patrick Gavin, 31, a city plumbing inspector.

The news of Miss Danielson's death was given police by Gavin, who said he did not know whether she shot herself or was slain by someone else. Coroner Herman N. Bundeson said the woman had been dead for more than ten hours and that from the position of the wounds could not have killed herself. She was shot three times.

Gavin told detectives he left Miss Danielson alive yesterday morning and that when he returned the girl was dead. The police found Gavin's wife at another address. She and Gavin's brother-in-law, Clarence Brinkley, were taken into a police station for questioning.

\$300 IS SOUGHT IN SUIT FILED TODAY

A complaint for conversion was filed in circuit court this morning entitled

in a residence of the defendant in Oakland City. The suit states that the plaintiff was seized with illness when he went to Hammondsville, O., and this prevented him from returning to Oakland City for more than 60 days.
